

Fourth Annual Dusty Frimodig Memorial Rifle Match

Hosted By

The Yellowstone Rifle Club

This match is being held in recognition of the contributions by Dusty Frimodig to the sport of High Power Rifle Competitive Shooting at the Yellowstone Rifle Club, Billings, Montana.

LOCATION: Yellowstone Rifle Club, located about 1-1/2 miles West of Billings, MT at 7212 Molt Road. (See map to range on YRC website www.yrc.org).

GPS to YRC front gate: N 45 deg 49.193 min, W 108 deg 41.994 min.

DATE: Saturday, June 2nd, 2018.

TIME: Registration opens at 0600, and closes at 0700.

Firing will commence at 0730, MDT.

ENTRIES: Entries are limited to 40 shooters. Advanced entry is strongly recommended, but not required. Advanced entries may indicate their preference for relays, but this cannot be guaranteed. Advance entries may be made by calling Neil Adams @ 406-861-7499, or email fivering1@outlook.com.

ELIGIBILITY: Any individual familiar with safe firearms handling practices, and who supports the rights of citizens to keep and bear arms. NRA membership is encouraged, but not required.

RULES: Current NRA High Power and F-Class rules will govern. See NRA rules on line at: <http://www.nrahq.org/compete/RuleBooks/HPR/hpr-index.pdf>. Use of an "Empty Chamber Indicator" (ECI) is required in all NRA matches and may be purchased for \$2.00 at registration. Hearing and eye protection are required both on the firing line and in the pits.

FIREARMS: Any Rifle (Rule 3.2), NRA Match Rifle (Rule 3.3), Palma Rifle (Rule 3.3.1). For the F-Class, any rifle, any sight, with reasonable support. See NRA website for F-Class Rules. Caliber will be limited to .35. Muzzle breaks are **NOT** allowed.

AMMUNITION: Any safe ammunition. Tracer, incendiary or explosive ammunition is **NOT** allowed.

CLASSIFICATION: The NRA classification system will be used in all matches.

Unclassified competitors will compete in the Master Class (Rule 19.2), or Assigned Classification (Rule 19.6) or Temporary Classification (Rule 19.4).

SQUADDING: All matches will be squadded. All competitors will be expected to shoot, score and perform pit duty, or provide a target puller.

TARGETS: MR-1, F-Class targets for F-Class.

NRA TYPE: NRA Approved.

MATCH FEES: Adults - \$35.00, Seniors and Grand Seniors - \$30.00, Juniors - \$15.00.
Make checks payable to Neil Adams.

CHALLENGES: \$1.00 challenge fee, payable at the time of the challenge.

COURSE OF FIRE:

MATCH 1: 600 yards prone, Any Rifle/Metallic Sights and F-Class.
20 rounds for record in a time limit of 25 minutes.

MATCH 2: 600 yards prone, Any Rifle/Metallic Sights and F-Class.
20 rounds for record in a time limit of 25 minutes.

MATCH 3: 600 yards prone, Any Rifle/Any Sight and F-Class.
20 rounds for record in a time limit of 25 minutes.

SIGHTER SHOTS: Unlimited sighting shots will be allowed in all separate matches.

It is the shooters responsibility to let the scorekeeper know when the shooter will go for record!

MATCH 4: Aggregate of Matches 1, 2, and 3 for Overall Match Winner and Winner in each Class.

AWARDS: Awards by NRA Class. Classes may be combined if fewer than 4 individuals are in a Class. Two awards will be given if there are at least 6 in a Class and 3 awards if there are 10 or more. Masters will not be combined with High Masters. If there are fewer than 5 High Masters, they will compete for Match Winner only. Recognition will be given to High Junior, High Senior, High Grand Senior, High Woman and High Service Rifle. Shooters may elect to shoot with optics during Matches 1

& 2, but will not be eligible to win the Overall Match Winner Award and will compete only with other optics shooters in Matches 1 & 2. Results will be announced for Division Winners about 30 minutes after all firing is complete and scores turned in. Cash awards will be mailed to Place winners, but physical awards will not be mailed due to the cost of packaging and shipping.

Stick around for the award ceremony!

TEAM MATCHES: Due to lack of interest in team shooting, we will not schedule a team match after the regular MR Match at this time. If, however, there is enough interest shown by entrants when calling in to enter the MR Match, we may have one by “popular demand”.

FACILITIES: Camping space is available at the YRC Range. The clubhouse has a toilet and potable water, but for limited use, as it must be trucked in. There are no shower facilities. Billings has many good motels and restaurants. A combination lock (4-5-6-7) will be put on the YRC gate Friday afternoon for competitor access to the range. The clubhouse will be unlocked as of Friday afternoon for those wishing to camp inside.
